



# CO 82 IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT GLENWOOD SPRINGS TO CARBONDALE

## JUNE 3-9 TRAFFIC UPDATE

On Monday, June 3, crews will mill and patch rockfall damage on the westbound/downvalley lane of Colorado Highway 82 just west of the Colorado Highway 133 exit (main Carbondale exit, near the scenic overlook). This will require a lane closure and reduced speeds from approximately 6 a.m. to 3 p.m. Delays are anticipated.

Crews have started guardrail replacement along the upvalley side of Colorado Highway 82. This work began in Glenwood Springs and will continue to move east along the upvalley side of CO 82 towards Carbondale. Guardrail replacement requires lane closures and is anticipated to be ongoing throughout July. Please use both lanes until the merge point. Delays are anticipated. Please allow extra travel time through the area.

Utility work continues in the Buffalo Valley and Spring Valley areas. This work includes directional drilling activities.

### Ongoing Road Impacts

Motorists should anticipate stretches of shoulder closures, lane closures, reduced speed limits and narrowed roads during daylight hours. Delays are anticipated; please allow extra travel time through the area. Remember, go slow for the cone zone.

Construction hours are 6 a.m. to 9 p.m. on weekdays. Please see below for information regarding lane closure restrictions.

### Lane Restriction Hours

In order to minimize impacts to the traveling public, there will be no lane closures during the morning peak for the eastbound/upvalley lanes (towards Aspen, 6-9 a.m.) or during the afternoon peak for the westbound/downvalley lanes (towards Glenwood Springs, 3-7 p.m.).
